ACTIVITY SUMMARY

Since the kickoff meeting in April, the consulting team has been busy conducting background research and holding interviews with stakeholders. The team held its first meeting with the Advisory Committee on June 26 to present the initial background research results and discuss the process going forward. The team is currently working with MOTSU to develop a program for the upcoming public meetings on July 30 and developing the Land Use Compatibility Analysis that will be presented to the Advisory Committee in August.

BACKGROUND RESEARCH

In conjunction with conducting stakeholder interviews, the consulting team has been conducting background research on a wide variety of topics, and have been gathering data, plans, documents, and studies that are being used to develop our base of knowledge about MOTSU and the region. Research has been conducted in the following topic areas, among others:

- Land Use and Growth Trends
- Land Use Plans and Regulations
- Environmental Issues
- Explosive Safety Policies and Regulations
- Transportation Plans and Infrastructure
- Utility Infrastructure
- MOUs / Licenses between MOTSU and Local Governments

STAKEHOLDER INTERVIEWS

Beginning in May, the consulting team began the process of interviewing the stakeholders that were identified in the Public Participation Plan. JUNE ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

On June 26, the first meeting of the JLUS Advisory Committee was held at the Cape Fear Council of Governments office. The meeting was led by the consulting team, and attended by representatives of each of the entities that are participating in the JLUS. The consulting team made a presentation (available under the Project Documents tab on the JLUS project website: http://capefearcog.org/sunnypoint/) that included a review of the JLUS process, a summary of the stakeholder interviews, background research on MOTSU's mission footprint, land use, regulatory matters, and environmental issues. Discussions were also held with the committee regarding the upcoming public meetings and the next Advisory Committee meeting, to be held in August.

JULY 30 PUBLIC MEETINGS

On July 30, public meetings will be held in Southport and Carolina Beach to begin the public involvement portion of the JLUS and introduce the project to the community. The first meeting will be held in Southport a the Community Building from 1 pm until 3:30 pm. The second meeting will take place at Carolina Beach Town Hall from 5 pm until 7:30 pm. These meetings will provide a good opportunity for elected officials and key staff members from the participating communities who are not on one of the committees to learn about the process.

The format for each of the meetings will be a combination of a presentation / drop-in "open house" type of meeting. Col. Mueller is currently scheduled to attend, and will be giving an abbreviated version of the briefing that was presented at the April Kickoff meeting. We are planning on delivering the presentation three times during the course of each meeting, and attendees will have the opportunity to engage with MOTSU and CFCOG staff and the consulting team both before and after the presentations.

Advertising for the meeting in accordance with the Public Participation Plan will begin in mid-July, and the assistance of each of our local government partners is requested to help advertise the public meetings through their local communications networks (websites, newsletters, etc.)

UPCOMING MEETINGS

The JLUS Advisory Committee will meet next in August to review the consulting team's work developing the Land Use Compatibility Analysis and to discuss the outcomes of the public meetings that will be held on July 30. The Advisory Committee will then meet again in October to review conflict resolution strategies related to any issues that are identified in the compatibility analysis. This will be followed by a meeting of the JLUS Policy Committee in November. The second round of Public Meetings will then be held following the Policy Committee meeting. A copy of the most recent version of the JLUS Project Schedule is included on the next page of the status report.

MOTSU CHANGE OF COMMAND

As a reminder, MOTSU will be undergoing a change of command, with COL Mueller transferring out of his current role in early August (following the public meetings) and a new commander assuming his position. Mr. Steve Kerr, who holds the civilian position of Deputy to the Commander at MOTSU, will remain in his position and will remain as the primary point of contact for the JLUS. Additional details regarding the change of command will be distributed to the JLUS partners as they become available.
