- 1. **Introduction and quorum** Having reached a quorum, Patrick Flanagan called the meeting to order at 10:03 AM. The attendees introduced themselves.
- 2. Changes or additions to the agenda No changes were made to the agenda.
- 3. **Approval of the minutes** There was one change to the minutes. Jake Vares' name was moved to the "Others Present" section; it has since been corrected. *Jeff Repp made a motion to approve the minutes with said correction. Sam Shore seconded the motion. The motion carried.*
- 4. **Public Comment** There was no comment from the public.
- 5. Vacancies and appointments Discussion began about expiring terms and vacant seats. The second Brunswick County Municipal alternate seat was agreed to be left vacant. Jerome Chestnut was nominated by Gordon Hargrove and seconded by Robert Lewis to fill the vacant Columbus County Municipal alternate seat. The nomination was approved unanimously. Robert Lewis motioned to nominate Sean Martin for the second Columbus County Municipal alternate seat. The nomination was approved unanimously. Sam Shore nominated Andrea Correll to serve in the second Pender County Municipal seat. The nomination was approved unanimously.

- 6. **Presentation: STIP 5.0 Update** Caitlin Marks, the Division 3 Planning Engineer gave a presentation on NCDOT cash reserves. She noted storm recovery and MAP Act settlements that were causing a funding crunch at NCDOT. This is resulting in projects in the STIP being delayed.
- 7. **DRAFT FY 2020-2021 PWP** Patrick Flanagan reviewed the draft PWP budget for next fiscal year with the group. *Helen Bunch made a motion to recommend the attached FY 2020-2021 PWP Draft be sent to TPD for review. Thomas Lloyd seconded the motion. The motion carried.*
- 8. **P6.0 Carryover Project Modifications/Deletions** Patrick Flanagan presented the carryover projects for review. Projects that needed modification were highlighted. Sam Shore made a motion to recommend the carryover projects and allow staff to work with NCDOT Division 6 staff to finalize the details on the modification projects. Jeff Repp seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 9. **P6.0** New Project Solicitation Patrick Flanagan outlined the project submission deadlines and available slots for the Cape Fear RPO. Staff requested that any new project ideas be submitted by January 15th so there would be time to review them prior to the February RPO meetings.
- 10. **2020 CFRPO Meeting Schedule** Patrick Flanagan went over the proposed schedule. Concern was raised over conflicting dates with the Wilmington MPO schedule. It was determined this month was an anomaly. *Jeff Repp made a motion to approve the schedule as presented, seconded by Thomas Lloyd. The motion carried.*
- 11. Monarch FY 2021 FTA Section 5310 Grant Funds Resolution Patrick Flanagan introduced the resolution. Allen Serkin clarified the nature of Monarch Transit. Robert Lewis made a motion to recommend approval of the resolution. Gordon Hargrove seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 12. **PAS-TRAN FY 2021 FTA Section 5310 Grant Funds Resolution** Patrick Flanagan introduced the resolution. Jim Longenbach, of PAS-TRAN, answered questions about their use of the funds. *Andrea Correll made a motion to recommend approval of the resolution. Sam Shore seconded the motion. The motion carried.*



- d. Pender County CTP: we are waiting on TPD staffing to begin this plan.


- e. Topsail Beach Non-motorized Transportation Plan: This plan was adopted on October 9th.

- 15. **Adjournment** There being no further discussion, the meeting was adjourned at 11:20 AM.































Bicycle Map Inset C, D, & E









Bicycle Map Inset F & G



Pedestrian Map Inset A, B, & C










Figure 1 - Sheet 5A of 5








Figure 1 - Sheet 5C of 5




BY THE NUMBERS

North Carolina's population of 10,542,548 is expected to top 12 million by 2035

COMPLETE STREETS POLICY 2.0



NCDOT planners, designers, and engineers are required to consider and incorporate multimodal facilities in the design and improvement of all appropriate transportation projects.



The Department is committed to collaborate with cities, towns, and communities to ensure planned pedestrian, bicycle, and transit options are included as an integral part of their total transportation vision.



DESIGN GUIDANCE

The policy identifies sources for facility design guidance. Facilities proposed in plans and project development must reference the design guidance provided by:

- NCDOT Roadway Design Manual and Cross Sections
- American Association of Highway Transportation Officials
- National Association of City Transportation Officials

COMPLETE STREETS PROJECT SHEET


Identifies planned and existing multimodal features of a proposed transportation project, and provides the ability to request exceptions to the policy, including:

- Unique site constraints
- Distance from existing/planned facilities
- Bicycle/Pedestrian prohibitions
- No existing/planned transit service

These are evaluated by the Complete Streets Review Team

Complete Streets Impacts:

- Planned multimodal facilities are consistently incorporated into NCDOT Planning and Project Development processes
- Multimodal considerations are consistently made during resurfacing and maintenance operations
