The Cape Fear Rural Transportation Planning Organization serves as the intergovernmental organization for local elected officials, the North Carolina Department of Transportation, and residents of Brunswick, Columbus and Pender Counties to work cooperatively to address transportation issues.

#### **CFRPO RTAC Member Remote Participation Policy and Procedure**

WHEREAS, the Rural Transportation Advisory Committee (RTAC) of the Cape Fear Rural Planning Organization (CFRPO) acknowledges that RTAC member attendance at RTAC meetings is essential for RTAC members to perform their official duties and to add to the diversity of thought and opinion in the RTAC's deliberations;

WHEREAS, the RTAC strongly encourages its members to be physically present for all RTAC meetings. The RTAC recognizes, however, that extenuating circumstances may prevent a member from being physically present at a meeting;

WHEREAS, the RTAC further recognizes that advances in online, audio and video conferencing technology make it possible for members in remote locations to communicate and deliberate effectively with each other during meetings via electronic methods which provide for simultaneous communication;

WHEREAS, the RTAC also recognizes that allowing RTAC members to participate remotely in meetings will help ensure full participation of the RTAC at its meetings.

NOW THEREFORE, in order to promote full participation of RTAC members at meetings while also ensuring access and transparency for the public as required by the Open Meetings Law, the RTAC authorizes its members to participate remotely in RTAC meetings subject to the following rules and requirements:

- **A. AUTHORIZED CIRCUMSTANCES FOR REMOTE PARTICIPATION.** The RTAC authorizes remote participation by its members in any meeting of the RTAC consistent with the following conditions and requirements.
- 1. A RTAC member may attend a meeting and participate in RTAC deliberations and decisions by remote participation if the member is prevented from physically attending the meeting due to any of the following reasons:
  - a. personal illness, quarantine requirement, or disability
  - b. out-of-town travel
  - c. unexpected lack of child-care
  - d. family member illness, death, or emergency
  - e. weather conditions
  - f. military service
  - g. employment/business obligations

h. an unexpected scheduling conflict

Remote participation is not intended to be used solely for a RTAC member's convenience.

- 2. Acceptable means of remote participation include telephone-, Internet-, or satellite enabled audio or video conferencing, or any other technology that provides for simultaneous communication during the meeting and enables the remote member(s) and all persons present at the Meeting location to be clearly audible to one another. "Simultaneous communication" shall mean any communication by conference telephone, conference video, or other electronic means. Text messaging, instant messaging, email, and web chat without audio are not acceptable means of remote participation.
- 3. No RTAC member may participate remotely more than three times during a calendar year; provided however, that in justifiable circumstances, the RTAC may, by majority vote, agree to waive this limitation.

#### B. CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR REMOTE PARTICIPATION.

- 1. A RTAC member may participate remotely only when the acceptable means of simultaneous communication allows for the member who is participating remotely to do all the following:
  - a. Hear what is said by other members of the RTAC.
  - b. Hear what is said by any individual addressing the RTAC.
  - c. To be heard by all members of the RTAC when speaking to the RTAC.
  - d. To be heard by all other persons present at the meeting location.
- 2. A RTAC member participating remotely will be considered present at the meeting for purposes of establishing a meeting quorum only during the period where simultaneous communication is maintained for that member.
- 3. A RTAC member considered present through remote participation will be permitted to vote on any action item at the meeting except:
  - a. any item for which the member was not participating remotely during the entire discussion and deliberation of the matter preceding the vote; and
  - b. any item that was being discussed when an interruption to the electronic communication occurred, if the RTAC's discussion was not suspended during the interruption. A brief loss of simultaneous communication will not disqualify the member from voting on the matter under discussion.
- 4. A RTAC member may participate remotely in a closed session of the RTAC provided the member provides assurance to the RTAC that no other person is able to hear, see, or otherwise participate in the closed session from the remote location.

#### C. PROCEDURE FOR REMOTE PARTICIPATION.

- 1. A RTAC member who desires to participate in a meeting remotely shall use his or her best efforts to notify the Chair or Executive Director at least one business day prior to the Meeting so that necessary arrangements for remote participation can be made.
- 2. The Chair or the Chair's designee at the meeting location shall initiate contact with the RTAC member prior to the start of the Meeting to secure remote participation.
- 3. The Chair shall announce the remote participant and the means of remote participation at the beginning of the meeting.
- 4. Any RTAC member participating remotely must identify himself or herself in each of the following situations:
  - a. When the roll is taken, or the meeting is commenced.
  - b. Prior to participating in the deliberations, including making motions, proposing amendments, and raising points of order.
  - c. Prior to voting.
- 5. The Chair may decide how to address technical difficulties that arise when utilizing remote participation.
- 6. When possible, the Chair should temporarily suspend discussion while reasonable efforts are made to correct any problem that interferes with the ability of a member who is participating remotely to hear or be heard clearly by all persons present at the meeting location and by any other RTAC members who may also be participating remotely at that meeting. If, however, the technical difficulties distract from or impede the orderly progress of the meeting, a majority of the members physically present may vote to end the remote participation.
- 7. A RTAC member participating remotely shall notify the Chair if leaving the meeting before it is adjourned or rejoining the meeting after a period of absence.
- 8. All votes taken during any meeting where a RTAC member is participating remotely will be by roll call vote.
- 9. All remote participation will be noted in the official RTAC minutes. Any interruption to or discontinuation of the RTAC member's remote participation will also be noted in the minutes.
- 10. The Lead Planning Agency is directed to provide the technology sufficient to implement this policy in accordance with all applicable laws.
- **D. NOT EXCLUSIVE.** This remote participation policy is intended to apply when there is no declaration of emergency under N.C.G.S. sec. 166A-19.20 in effect. Upon the issuance of a declaration of emergency under N.C.G.S. sec. 166A-19.20, the provisions of N.C.G.S. sec. 166A-19.24 and any other applicable statutes or regulations shall control.

#### NOVEMBER TPD UPDATES CAPE FEAR RPO

#### **NOVEMBER 2021**

#### **Cape Fear RPO Area Updates:**

**Brunswick County Model**: The Brunswick County Model was completed in February of last year.

**Brunswick County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP)**: Currently the TPD engineers are creating internal documents for peer review, management review and steering committee review prior to going to public involvement. Post public involvement, there will be one more round of reviews prior to adoptions and endorsements.

**Columbus County CTP**: No updates on this CTP, still waiting for everything to open up post COVID-19 prior to starting public involvement sessions.

**Wilmington Model:** The 2045 Travel Demand Model and 2045 Wilmington MPO MTP was adopted on 11/18/2020 by the Wilmington MPO Board.

**Bridge Dedication and Teen Driver Safety Week:** *William M. Sue Bridge Dedication* - The Interstate 140 bridge over U.S. 74 outside Wilmington is now named for William M. Sue, the former Brunswick County commissioner who requested during his first term in office that the interstate be completed as soon as possible.

Sue served on the Brunswick County Board of Education for eight years and then spent another 18 years on the Brunswick County Board of Commissioners, including five years as its chairman.

Sue was honored Oct. 15 during a dedication ceremony attended by several past and present elected officials who lauded Sue's public service.

*Teen Driver Safety Week* - Every week, hundreds of teenagers across the state get their licenses. National Teen Driver Safety Week, which runs from Oct. 17-23, raises awareness about the dangers and pitfalls new drivers often face.

**Brunswick County Bridge Requires Maintenance**: A bridge on Daws Creek Road in Brunswick County was scheduled to be closed the week after while N.C. Department of Transportation crews performed maintenance.

The closure was scheduled to begin at 8 a.m. Oct. 11 and be completed by 5 p.m. Oct. 15. This allowed maintenance crews to safely replace a pipe at a tributary of Daws Creek near Funston Road.

The award recognized NCDOT for its pilot program to install thermoplastic lane markings, which are more durable and better at reflecting headlights, thanks to embedded glass beads in the plastic paint.
