RE: P7.0 Carryover Projects

NCDOT is allowing MPOs, RPOs, and Divisions to each select two projects that were newly submitted during P6.0 to carryover into P7.0 without counting against the maximum number of new project submittals. The attached list contains the eligible highway projects. Non-highway projects are eligible, but we are unlikely to need additional non-highway submittals. The first project highlighted in blue has been selected by Division 3 as one of its submittals. It is located in Pender County so I propose that our two selected projects be located in Brunswick and Columbus counties. The highest scoring highway project in Brunswick County and at least primarily located within the RPO is the widening of NC 211 from US 17 to Midway Rd (H183735). The highest scoring highway project primarily in Columbus County is the widening of US 701 from Complex St to E Fifth St in Tabor City (H184205). Staff recommends that those two project be selected as the RPO carryover projects. Those on this list not selected to carryover will still be considered for submittal as one of the CFRPO's 19 new submittals (per mode) later this summer.

**Brunswick County Model:** The Brunswick County Model was completed in February of last year.

**Brunswick County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP):** The Brunswick County CTP is ready for final public involvement sessions. We have scheduled three in-person sessions in May throughout the county from 5pm-7:30pm. First in-person session will be on May 2<sup>nd</sup> in Calabash, second session will be on May 4<sup>th</sup> in Bolivia, and last session will be on May 9<sup>th</sup> in St. James. Virtual sessions will be open from May 1<sup>st</sup> – May 15<sup>th</sup> on public input. All details are on the last two pages of these updates in your package. After feedback from the public, the CTP committee will meet one last time to review comments and make final changes before the CTP goes in for adoptions.

**Columbus County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP):** Public involvement sessions are complete, and the committee is reviewing the maps and recommendations at the moment. The committee plans to meet one last time before the CTP goes in for adoptions.

**Wilmington Model:** The 2050 Travel Demand Model (TDM) work started on 3/1/2022. The TDM is being developed for the next Wilmington MTP. Currently the engineer and modeler are working on checking and updating network attributes. TPD is also continuing to work with the MPO to collect data.
