- 1. **Introduction and quorum** Having reached a quorum, Mr. Williams called the meeting to order at 9:02 AM.
- 2. **Invocation/Pledge of Allegiance** Mr. Williams led the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3. Ethics awareness and conflict of interest statement Mr. Williams read the statement to the RTAC. No conflicts of interest were raised and no members recused themselves from any votes.
- 4. Additions or corrections to the agenda With no proposed changes or additions to the agenda, Mr. Helms made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Mr. Forte seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 5. **Approval of Minutes** Mr. Helms made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Ms. Williams-Rowland seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 6. **Public comment** There was no public comment.
- 7. **Brunswick County Community Connectivity Plan** Ms. Hatcher provided a presentation discussing results from the Brunswick County Community Connectivity Plan. Ms. Hatcher said this is preliminary data, and they are continuing to survey residents. She hopes to present

- the findings to the public at the end of December. Ms. Hatcher also gave a status update on her Department's grant applications. *No action was taken*.
- 8. **FY 2019-2020 PWP Amendment** Mr. Williams opened the hearing at 10:20. Mr. Serkin presented the PWP amendment for the current fiscal year, with a slight amendment to a budget line item. There were no comments. The hearing was closed at 10:22. *Mr. Helms made a motion to approve the PWP amendment as presented. Ms. Batts seconded the motion. The motion carried.*
- 9. NC 211/East Coast Greenway Feasibility Study Steering Committee Mr. Serkin reviewed recommendations for the composition of the Steering Committee. Commissioner Forte requested to be a member of the Steering Committee. Mr. Helms made a motion to approve the RPO's authority to determine the composition of the Committee. Mr. Forte seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 10. **P6.0 Preliminary Carryover Project Modifications/Deletions** Mr. Serkin reviewed the list of carryover projects and ones the RPO is currently working with NCDOT to modify. He said the next meeting will be the last review for any additional modifications/deletions. Mr. Williams asked Mr. Serkin to conduct a presentation to the City of Northwest Board on projects affecting their jurisdiction. Mr. Russ made a motion to approve the P6.0 Preliminary Carryover Project Modifications/Deletions List. Mr. Helms seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 11. **P6.0** New Project Solicitation Mr. Serkin reminded the Committee of upcoming deadlines for new project considerations. He explained the requirements for the two prioritization categories: modernization and mobility. He said the modernization category allows communities to apply for various roadway improvements. Mr. Serkin also advised if a public engagement process is utilized for projects, to start on this now because the August 21<sup>st</sup> deadline is fast approaching. *No action was taken*.
- 12. NC Ferry Tug Naming Resolution Ms. Peele explained the NC Ferry Division's process in naming the tug vessels. These tugs are expected to be completed in 2020. Ms. Williams-Rowland made a motion to approve the naming of the vessels after cities and regions in NC. Mr. Helms seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 13. Lake Waccamaw Bicycle and Pedestrian Planning Grant Resolution Mr. Serkin said the Town of Lake Waccamaw requests the Committee's support in applying for a Project Acceleration Plan grant. This grant would allow the Town to complete a bicycle and pedestrian loop around Lake Waccamaw. Mr. Helms made a motion to approve the grant application. Ms. Williams-Rowland seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 14. **Reports/Updates** Mr. Serkin provided an update on Prioritization 6.0, highlighting the carryover projects and noting that in this prioritization round points may be moved from the Region to Division tier. Mr. Serkin stated that included in the agenda packet is NCDOT's new scoring criteria and to consult these documents when considering a new project. Mr. Serkin said the RPO's non-motorized plan for Topsail Beach is now on the Planning Board's agenda

for adoption. Ms. Marks and Mr. Kimes provided an update for Division 3. Mr. Sturdivant provided an update for Division 6. Ms. Sarder gave an update for the Transportation Planning Branch, noting the Columbus County CTP planner is back and its adoption will be moving forward. Ms. Sarder is working on the Brunswick County CTP Model and she hopes to present it in March 2020. The Pender County CTP has not started because of staffing shortages. The NC Move Survey closed last month, and they are now in the process of reviewing this data. Ms. Sarder also mentioned the Zero Emission Vehicle (ZEV) survey is now open on NCDOT's website.

- 15. **Open Discussion** Mr. Serkin reminded the Committee he has been selected as the next Executive Director of the Cape Fear Council of Governments and a new RPO Director will be selected at the end of the month.
- 16. **Adjournment** There being no further discussion, the meeting was adjourned without objection at 10:29 AM.

## **New Business:**

**Columbus County CTP** – The CTP is under review by the Division Planning Engineer (DPE). The DPE plans on finalizing the comments by end of the week. After the comments have been incorporated into the CTP, the CTP will go into the 30-day public comment period before going into adoptions.

**Brunswick County Model**: Working on FY SE Data Analysis at the moment.

**NCMoves 2050**: There will be multiple events that started in September and will go through January to collect the third round of surveys for NCMoves 2050. Contact Nastasha Earle-Young at the NCDOT's Transportation Planning Division for more details.

**2019-2020 Map:** The 2019-20 State Transportation Map is now available and free of charge.

**Preliminary Engineering Project Suspension List:** As of August 30, 2019 NCDOT, will temporarily suspend "preliminary engineering" on most projects that do not receive funding from GARVEE bonds, BUILD NC bonds or Federal grants. This action does not impact projects currently awarded for construction, scheduled to be awarded for construction within the next 12 months, or are currently under construction. Work for preliminary engineering on the attached list will suspend approximately 900 transportation projects.

**Planning for Resiliency:** The Hydraulics Unit of NCDOT recently led a Kickoff meeting for the preparation of Flood Resilience Feasibility studies. These studies will show where roads in NC have previously flooded. A resiliency planning workgroup has formed that is made up of TPD planning staff, MPO staff, RPO staff, and other NCDOT staff to help with developing a data driven process to include resiliency in our infrastructure planning. The goal of these studies is to have a statewide map of frequently flooded roads in NC (all 700+ of them).
