### Federal Aid Overview

Purpose of Authorization Act

- Authorizes programs
- Sets program-specific requirements
- Authorizes "funds" (line of credit)
- Specifies fund characteristics (formula, match, etc.)
- Typically covers multiple years

#### **Reimbursement Program**

Tied to specific systems - 25% of NC mileage eligible

Authorizations – set upper limit of funding

Apportionment (all states) – statutory formula distribution to states

Allocation (not all states) – administrative distribution to specific programs

Obligation – commitment to reimburse states for eligible costs

### Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

One Hundred Seventeenth Congress of the United States of America

#### AT THE FIRST SESSION

Begun and held at the City of Washington on Sunday, the third day of January, two thousand and twenty-one

#### An Act

To authorize funds for Federal-aid highways, highway safety programs, and transit programs, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of  $_{\odot}$  the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.

(a) Short Title.—This Act may be cited as the "Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act".




Title I – Highway Trust Fund


- Authorizes expenditures through 10/1/2026

- Transfer \$90B to Highway Account
- Transfer \$28B to Mass Transit Account

### Estimated Combined HTF Year-end Balance without IIJA \$118B GF Transfer




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




#### Total IIJA ~\$1 Trillion - FFY 22-26






### FFY 2022 IIJA Apportionment\* Comparison (\$M)

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


