The Cape Fear RPO is required by state law to develop and follow a local input methodology for prioritizing all transportation projects within the RPO boundary that compete for state and federal funding.

The Cape Fear RPO's methodology was approved by NCDOT and the RTAC in April 2024. RPO staff has worked with NCDOT Division staff as well as RTCC and RTAC members to follow that methodology and develop a recommended list of local input point assignments for projects competing at the Regional Impact tier.



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Cape Fear RPO's P7.0 Methodology


Total of 1300 points to assign (per tier).

Ranking Approach: 4 Criteria

- 1) P7.0 Quantitative Score 50%
- 2) Division Priority 20%
- 3) County Priority 20%
- 4) Project Development 10%

Preliminary Points assigned in 3 waves.

- 1) Top 2 Highway projects per County.
- 2) Top 3 Non-highway projects.
- 3) Remaining points cascade to next highest scoring projects, regardless of mode.
