I. START-UP

- Call to Order RTAC Chair Frank Williams called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM.
- 2. Invocation/Pledge of Allegiance Mr. Jeff Winecoff led the group in an invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3. Roll Call RPO Staff took a roll call of all attendees.

II. PUBLIC HEARING

8. Presentation: Cape Fear RPO P7.0 Regional Impact Local Input Points – RPO Staff provided an overview of the draft local input point assignments for projects competing at the Regional Impact funding tier. These point assignments are the result of following the RPO's Local Input Point Methodology as approved by the RTAC and NCDOT. The only deviation from the Methodology is to assign the final 81 points to H230501 (improvements to NC 87 in Boiling Spring Lakes) instead of to H183735 (widening NC 211; combination of H090806-A and H090806-C, which are both receiving points already).

RPO staff provided further clarification that local input points, when assigned to a project, essentially act as a "boost" to a given project's P7.0 Score. In the Regional Impact tier, if the RPO assigns 100 points to a project (the maximum allowed), that will increase the project's P7.0 score by 15 points. NCDOT can also assign up to 100 points on a project, adding another 15 points to the P7.0 score. This is because projects at the Regional Impact tier are 30% local input based. The remaining 70% is straight from the original P7.0 quantitative data score (which is why Regional scores are on a scale of 70 instead of 100). Once all local input points are assigned, available funding will be awarded to the projects with the highest total score.

9. <u>Public Comment</u> – The RTAC Chair opened the public hearing for members of the public to provide comments on the point assignments. There were no comments or questions from the public and the Chair closed the public hearing.

10. P7.0 Regional Impact Local Input Points — The P7.0 Regional Impact Local Input Point assignment window is from Tuesday, May 28th through Friday, August 30th. Cape Fear RPO staff, with assistance from NCDOT and RPO members, has evaluated projects according to the Local Input Point methodology approved by NCDOT and the RTAC in April 2024. Priorities of Existing Committed Projects — As part of the development of the 2026-2035 Draft STIP, NCDOT is seeking input from Planning Organizations and Divisions on priorities of existing committed projects. These projects have previously been selected for funding through Prioritization cycles 3.0, 4.0, and 5.0. The input will be used to assist the STIP Unit when adjusting schedules to meet federal and state fiscal restraint requirements. The recommendation from the RTCC was to change the ranking of the two committed Division projects in Pender County and rank R-5900 ahead of R-5899 at the request of the Town of Surf City. Mr. Hugh Cannady made a motion to approve the reranking of existing committed projects as presented. Mr. Jerry Groves seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken.

14. Reports/Updates

- Cape Fear RPO RPO Staff provided updates on the following:
 - o Revisions to 2024-2033 STIP: These updates were provided in the agenda packet.
 - O IMD Multimodal Planning Grant Awards: Oak Island and Southport were both awarded the planning grants they applied for earlier this spring. RPO staff assisted with both applications and the RTAC provided resolutions of support for both. Oak Island's grant will be to develop a new Bicycle Transportation Plan and Southport's is for a Project Acceleration Plan which will build upon its existing Pedestrian Plan.
 - Pender County CTP: The public survey for the CTP remains open until September 1st.
 - o NCDOT's Fall Litter Sweep will be from September 14th to 28th.
 - NCDOT's Advance NC Transportation website a new resource for the public to engage with to learn more about new approaches to transportation funding.
- NC Ports (Port of Wilmington) There was no additional update by the Port.
- NCDOT Ferry Division There was no update by the Ferry Division.
- NCDOT Integrated Mobility Division (IMD) There was no update by IMD.
- NCDOT Division 3 (Brunswick & Pender) Michelle Howes gave an update on Division 3 projects, as included in the agenda packet.
- NCDOT Division 6 (Columbus) Philip Hart gave an update on Division 6 projects, as included in the agenda packet.
- NCDOT Transportation Planning Division (TPD) Hemal Shah provided TPD updates for CTPs across the RPO area, as included in the agenda packet.
- NC Board of Transportation There was no update by the Board member.

V. OTHER

15. Open Discussion – Mr. Frank Williams expressed a desire to find ways to involve residents from portions of the RPO's counties that are not within the RPO's municipalities. For example,

this includes residents from the Waccamaw region of Brunswick County, which has no municipality established to represent residents. These large unincorporated areas are important stakeholders to involve in county-wide meetings when the RPO membership discusses items such as Prioritization project submittals.

Mr. Jeff Winecoff highlighted that the upcoming detours due to BR-0139 (bridge replacement on NC 133 near Funston) will only exacerbate the traffic issues on NC 87 through Boiling Spring Lakes, specifically at the intersection of Fifty Lakes Drive.

Multiple committee members emphasized the connected nature of transportation improvement projects; careful consideration is needed to ensure that projects do not have overwhelmingly adverse effects to other segments of the network. Whether this "domino effect" can be considered during Prioritization scoring is beyond the control of this committee, but it should still be accounted for in future project planning.

Mr. Frank Williams and Mr. Rich Alt discussed whether the RPO should have a legislative agenda to advocate for rural transportation issues in the region and across the state. RPO staff will follow up at the next RTAC meeting on the extent to which this matter can be addressed or pursued by the committee.

RPO staff reminded RTAC members that agenda packets can be mailed in advance of RTAC meetings upon request.

16. Adjourn - The meeting was adjourned at 10:20 AM.
